

CODIAGRAM

Looking at a hand in close-up, we can see a variety of minor marks and textures and, of course, the distinctive fingerprint. All these can offer clues to the overall pattern of the hand.

Marks refer to the same area of life as the line or mount on which they appear. So, although the mark of a square always indicates protection, its meaning varies with its position. On the mount of Jupiter it protects against failure in worldly ambitions; on the mount of Mercury, against mental stress; on the heartline, from unhappiness in love; and so on.

Obviously these marks will not appear as clearly in a hand as in the illustrations, but they must be strong and

distinct, however uneven in shape.

Fingerprint patterns are established about eighteen weeks after conception. Unlike the other lines on the hand, from then on they are fixed and unchanging. This, as we know, makes them very useful in the detection of criminals, but they can also be useful in the detection of personality. When more than one type of fingerprint pattern appears in a hand, their different characteristics will be blended in the personality. The number of fingers involved can give us an indication of the balance of that blend: a person with several fingers showing tented arches is likely to be considerably more stubborn than a person with just one!

Palmists also literally read between the lines. The area between the lines of head and heart should be a neat and well-defined oblong for the best possible portent of a balanced and steady progress through life – and nearly smooth, empty of all the collections of tiny lines found elsewhere. Otherwise there may be a tendency to imbalance, extremism of one kind or another, and a somewhat erratic and fitful life. And the larger the triangular area formed by the lines of head, life, and

health, the better the omen.

MARKS AND TEXTURES

- a Chaining Weakness, indecision, a tendency to be unlucky.
- b Forked line Contradictions, divisions of interest.
- c Doubled line Reinforcing and strengthening.
- d Island Period of stress, weakness, breakdown.
- e Break Unpleasant interruption in the progress of life.
- f Bar Opposition, a barrier.
- g Cross A shock or upheaval. If at the end of the line, failure.
- h Star Sudden happenings, which may be triumphant or tragic. A many-starred hand indicates an exciting life.

FINGERPRINTS

A Low arch Hard-hearted, insensitive, sceptical, unemotional, and materialistic.

B Tented arch Highly strung, artistic, and impulsive – but stubborn.

C Loop Mild-tempered and straightforward, with a quick, lively, and versatile mind.

D Whorl An individualist with a strong, definite personality. Potentially brilliant, best when selfemployed.

E Mixed A mixed-up and muddle-headed personality. If you have any difficulty in differentiating one type of pattern from another, look for the triadus (F). An arch print does not have a triadus, a loop print has one, and a whorl has two.






The three major lines – the head, heart, and life lines – appear on nearly every hand. Although it is possible to have one or more of these lines missing, in practice it is unlikely that you will ever see such a palm.

The lifeline does not indicate how long you will live: the old wives' tale that a short lifeline indicates a short life should be forgotten. What the lifeline does show is the strength of a person's vitality, their "life energy," and so it should be read in conjunction with the thumb, the finger of Jupiter, and the mount of Venus, which are also important in this area. Similarly, the heartline, which is concerned with our emotions, should be referred to those other indicators of our feelings, the finger of Mercury and the mount of Venus. The headline is concerned with our mental attitudes. Like all the lines in the palm, it should be related to the shape of the hand. For example, you would normally expect to find a straight headline on a practical hand: a sloping headline would be unusual. (It could indicate a person who uses their imagination in a practical way, perhaps a designer or inventor.) But a sloping headline on a sensitive hand would merely act as a confirmation of the imaginative nature you had already suspected. Unlike the major lines, the minor lines - the line of fate, the line of the sun, and so on - can be present or absent. Indeed, the lines on the palm can and do change, growing clearer or less clear, developing disruptions or losing them. So it would not be surprising to see a strong line of fate (the most changeable of all the lines) in the hand of an adult where there had not been one in the child. And in some cases, we would certainly prefer the line to be absent: the more robust your constitution, the less likely you are to have the misnamed line of health in your hand. Of the more commonly occurring lines, the line of fate relates to our destiny; the line of the sun to our good fortune, and to our creativity; the girdle of Venus to passion; the Via Lasciva to our desires - for money, sensual pleasure, and so on; and the bracelets to health, wealth, and travel. The lines of health, marriage, children, and influence have their own eponymous spheres of influence.

RARE LINES

Some lines are extremely rare. The line of intuition (a), for example, which curves from the mount of Mercury to the mount of the moon, and is only found in the hands of the strongly psychic, as is the mystic cross (b), a large cross appearing in the space between the headline and the heartline. Or the ring of Saturn (c), a semicircle on the mount of Saturn, which is held to indicate a constant striving for the impossible, leading to continual disappointment. And the ring of Jupiter (d), known as Solomon's ring, which circles the base of the index finger and is found in the hands of great leaders and those of great wisdom.



HEADLINE

Length This indicates the level of intelligence, breadth of understanding, and use made of intellectual potential. The longer the line, the greater the importance played by intellectual matters.

Straight across palm (1) Practical and realistic, down-to-earth, a good organizer.

Long and straight Shrewd, a good forward planner with a good memory.

Sloping toward mount of the moon (2) Sensitive and imaginative.


Long, reaching top part of mount of the moon (3) A talent for self-expression.

Long, reaching lower part of mount of the moon Over-imaginative.

Running toward center of wrist Out of touch with reality.

Curving up toward heartline Good business ability, good at making money.

Mars, the god of war, does not give his name to any of

the fingers, but instead to two mounts on the hand, the upper and lower mounts of Mars. The upper is linked with moral courage and resistance; the lower, roughly triangular in shape, with physical courage and aggression.

Q MOUNT OF VENUS (1)

Broad, firm, and rounded Healthy, warmhearted, sincere, compassionate, loves children.

Flat, underdeveloped Delicate constitution, detached and self-contained nature.

Large A high degree of vitality.

Very large, overdeveloped Extremely energetic physically, hedonistic.

High and firm Highly sexed.

High and soft Excitable and fickle.

Lower part of mount more prominent Energy probably channeled into artistic concerns.

Marked with a large saltire A person who has only one great love in their life.

o LOWER MOUNT OF MARS (2)

Normal size Physically brave, resolute, able to keep a cool head in a crisis.

Flat, underdeveloped Cowardly, afraid of physical suffering.

Very large, overdeveloped Violent and argumentative, possibly cruel, but never afraid of taking risks.

4 MOUNT OF JUPITER (3)

Normal size Enthusiastic, ambitious, good-tempered, friendly. Self-confident and generous. Conventional and conservative at heart, a lover of pomp and ritual. Flat, underdeveloped Selfish, lazy, inconsiderate, lacks confidence.

Very large, overdeveloped Arrogant and overbearing, totally self-centered, driven by ambition.

Connected with the mount of Saturn Happier working in partnership than alone.

5 MOUNT OF SATURN (4)

Normal size An introspective nature, serious-minded, studious, prudent.

Flat, underdeveloped A run-of-the-mill person with an unremarkable destiny.

Very large, overdeveloped Gloomy, withdrawn, a recluse. Possibly morbid and suicidal.

Leaning toward the mount of Jupiter A solemn person who aims high.

Leaning toward the mount of Apollo Has an intense appreciation of beauty.

MOUNT OF APOLLO (MOUNT OF THE SUN) (5)

Normal size A pleasant, sunny nature, with a lucky streak. Has good taste and artistic leanings.

Flat, underdeveloped Leads a dull, aimless existence, and has no interest in the arts or any form of culture. Very large, overdeveloped Pretentious, extravagant, and hedonistic.

Leaning toward the mount of Mercury Able to make money from the arts.

Connected with the mount of Mercury Any introvert or extravert tendencies shown in the fingers will be reinforced.

MOUNT OF MERCURY (6)

Normal size Quick-thinking but subtle. Lively, persuasive, hard-working, needs variety and company. Flat, underdeveloped Dull, gullible, and humorless. A failure.

Large A good sense of humor.

Very large, overdeveloped A sharp conman, materialistic and light-fingered, a cheat.

Marked by short, straight lines (a) The "medical stigmata." Caring, compassionate, a potential healer. Usually found in the hands of doctors and nurses.

O UPPER MOUNT OF MARS (7)

Normal size Morally courageous.

Flat, underdeveloped Cowardly, interested only in self-preservation.

Very large, overdeveloped Bad-tempered, sarcastic, mentally cruel.

MOUNT OF THE MOON (8)

Normal size Sensitive and perceptive, romantic and imaginative, artistic, possibly with a great love of the sea.

Flat, underdeveloped Unimaginative, unsympathetic, unstable, cold, bigoted.

Very large, overdeveloped Overimaginative, introspective, probably untruthful.


High and firm Creative, with a powerful and fertile imagination.

The base of the thumb, its third phalange, is called the mount of Venus. And – like the goddess, or the planet in astrology – this phalange brings emotional matters to join will and logic in the thumb's overall range of reference.

As we have already seen, the areas nearer the thumb are concerned with our relationships with the outside world, and those farther away with inner matters. So on the other side of the palm is another important pad of flesh, called the mount of the moon. And it reflects both lunar folklore and astrological references in its connection with intuitive, imaginative, even mystic mental activity.



PHALANGES OF THE THUMB

Equal length (a) Well-balanced personality.

Full thumb - first and second of fairly even width (b) Blunt, outspoken.

Broad and sturdy first Plenty of stamina and welldirected energy.

First longer than second Energy uncontrolled by logic. Very tapered first Lacks stamina and vitality.

Clubbed first (c) Violent, full of uncontrolled energy. Traditionally the "murderer's thumb."

Broad and sturdy second Logical, thoughtful, thinks before acting.

Second longer than first Inhibited, feels restricted. Waisted second (d) Quick-thinking, tactful, impulsive, can be evasive.

the square shape will balance the impulsive nature shown by the smooth joints, and indicate a person of good intuition. But in a pointed, smooth-jointed finger we have a double indication of impulsiveness – quite possibly a person who never looks before they leap. For many palmists, the thumb is almost as important to a reading as all the fingers put together. Some Hindu palmists are known to restrict their reading to the thumb alone, and to ignore the rest of the hand! The thumb bears no god's name (although it is sometimes linked with the first house of the horoscope) but it is a key indicator of the level of vitality or life energy. The larger the thumb, the more vital and powerful the

personality, especially when linked with a strong index finger.

The thumb's phalanges each have their traditional associations – the first (bearing the nail) with the will, the second with logic. Like the fingers, the thumb properly has three phalanges, but the third is the pad of flesh that frames one side of the palm. This is traditionally put together with the other similarly prominent pads on the hand, which are known as mounts.



THE SET OF THE FINGERS

The second finger is never set low, but decides the level for the other fingers.


Even set (a) A person with a positive nature and plenty of common sense, one who will do well in life.



Palmistry has its connections with astrology. The signs of the zodiac, for instance, divide into four groups of three that are linked with the four elements, as are the modern types of hand shapes. But the astrological connection becomes even more explicit with the names given to the fingers – names of Roman gods that are also in most cases the names of planets, and so impart some of the planetary qualities as the horoscope sees them.

The index finger is the finger of Jupiter – the king of the gods for the dominant finger. In this finger can be seen much of the person's outer, worldly tendencies – ambition, prospects for success, life energy.

strong it reveals the presence of the saturnine qualities of character – a certain seriousness and melancholy. The third or ring finger is the finger of Apollo (astrologically, the sun), with which we move toward inner concerns. And the little finger is the finger of Mercury, revealing much about human relationships. Palmists look too at the shape of the fingers, their flexibility, and their position on the hand in relation to one another. They also read much into the separate segments or "phalanges." So, as always, you should remember to take the overall view. For example, in a square, smooth-jointed finger, the reflective qualities of

Traditionally, fortune tellers asserted that there were seven basic types of hand shape. And these seven revealed some equally traditional attitudes to society and its hierarchy – for at one end was the delicate, languid hand of the aristocrat, and at the other was the peasant's coarsened and work-hardened fist. But even so, there may be useful clues to be gained in your own readings from this old classification, and the seven types deserve to be briefly noted.


These days, however, palmists are more ready to admit that these seven rigid classifications are somewhat unrealistic. So modern palmists have refined their classification of hand shapes into only four basic types, which do tend more or less to occur in reality. They also keep a traditional flavor by relating them to the four elements of the ancient world – earth, fire, water, and air – which are linked in turn with corresponding character traits.

Whichever classification system you use, however, it will give you nothing more than a few initial hints, general pointers to start off your overall reading. Further pointers can be found in the size and texture of



TRADITIONAL HAND CLASSIFICATIONS

- 1 Elemental A thick, broad, short-fingered hand. A slow-thinker, perhaps with a crude, physical nature.
- 2 Square (or useful) A square palm, with broad and blunt fingers. A practical, conventional, unadaptable, unintellectual nature.
- 3 Spatulate A spade-shaped and straight-fingered hand. An ambitious and energetic nature, independent, erratic, not much given to intellect.
- 4 Philosophical Broad-palmed, with heavy joints on the fingers. A logical, cautious nature, thoughtful and introverted, analytic rather than fanciful.
- 5 Artistic (or conic) A long and flexible hand with tapering fingers. A sensitive, creative nature, more impulsive than methodical.

- 7 Mixed A necessary, if vague, category, since almost no-one fits precisely into just one of the foregoing six pigeonholes. Most people's hands combine two or more of the types mentioned, as do most people's natures.



The cardinal rule in palmistry, as in all the major forms of fortune telling, is that an overall view is essential. You cannot hope to achieve any certain picture of your subject's character and potential from only the shape of the hand, or from any other isolated detail. You must wait until all the clues have been gathered and see then how one factor balances or compensates for another, how different elements are reinforced, others canceled out, and so on.

This paramount rule partly explains why good palmists rarely make sweeping, unequivocal statements along the lines of "you will be rich this time next year" or "you have only six months to live." There are too many factors in a subject as broad and complex as palmistry. They cannot be interpreted simply, in the way of the omens of folk belief, or the flat assertions of newspaper horoscopes. What you achieve, when all the details are collated, is a probable pattern, a set of tendencies, with very little in it of fixed, unavoidable fate. Every reading, like every human being, is a mixture of good and bad.


There are some further points you should remember when making your readings. First, be careful. Real

hands seldom show marks as clearly as do the illustrations in this book, and you will need to have studied a great many hands before you can be completely confident in your recognition of detail. Second, be open-minded. Don't leap to conclusions about the nature of a hand, for there is then the temptation to ignore other details, or subconsciously to twist their meaning, when they do not conform to your too-hasty interpretation. Let your reading build slowly, and accept all the contradictions, divergences, and inconsistencies.

Third, remember to correlate all the details into a complete, balanced picture before delivering your interpretation. Most people get along through life fairly well, with plenty of ups and downs, good times and bad, in general balancing each other out. Try to find a similar kind of balance in your readings. And finally, consider the chirognomists' assertion that destiny as revealed in the hand is not fixed and predetermined. The lines and marks can change, it is said, over a period of time, as obviously can the fleshiness of the fingers and mounts. And so good or ill omens may in fact come and go.


Palmistry is a misleading name, for a great deal more than the palm of the hand is considered in this type of prediction. The experts prefer more resonantly impressive terms like "chirognomy," "chirology," or even "chiromancy," from the Greek word cheir, meaning hand. But whatever you choose to call it, it remains a process rooted in the belief that you literally hold your future in your hands.

People have always been fascinated by the markings on their hands - palm prints have even been discovered in Stone Age cave paintings. Although no physical evidence exists to support their theories, some practitioners have claimed that the origins of palmistry lie far back with the ancient Egyptians, Chaldeans, Sumerians, or Babylonians. It seems likely that palmistry began in the east and spread to the west, perhaps carried by the Romany peoples. The earliest verifiable references to the art seem to be in Indian literature of the Vedic period (c.2000BC) in the east, and in the works of Aristotle (384-322BC) in the west but both these bear witness to a rich history of oral tradition on the subject. Palmistry has had a checkered history: in the seventeenth century it was taught at the universities of Leipzig and Halle in Germany, while at

the same time it was being outlawed in England as a form of witchcraft.

But why read hands? There are thousands of nerve endings in your hands which are in direct contact with your brain, and so there is a constant two-way traffic of impulses along the nerves. Because of this traffic, the lines and marks on your hands are supposed to show a reflection of your personality, to mirror your physical and emotional condition. Palmists have always known this intuitively: today's scientists are finding evidence to support the theory, and some geneticists and psychiatrists already use hand analysis to assist them in the diagnosis of a variety of physical and mental illnesses.

The proper place to begin both the study of palmistry and any specific reading is with the whole hand. Or, in fact, both hands, since your left hand is said to indicate the potentialities that you were born with, and your right hand to reveal your individual nature as it is now, and what its future may be – unless you are left-handed, when the reverse applies. The differences can be usefully revealing of the directions the subject has taken through life, and of the effect of the years on the subject.



Handprints

There is much to be said for reading a hand from a print, rather than the hand itself. You will be in no danger of being affected by the subject's possible reactions to your comments as you build up the reading. And if you keep the prints safely, some years later you can determine for yourself whether the hands have changed in any of their details – and if so, what those changes may indicate.

The easiest way to produce a good print is with a small roller. Squeeze out some ink (water-based for easy removal) onto a smooth surface, and pass the roller through it several times (a). Then use the roller to transfer a thin film of ink as evenly as possible to all the surfaces of the palm (b). Make the print (c) by pressing the subject's hand carefully but firmly onto a sheet of paper, making sure that you get a good impression of the center of the palm as well as the fingers and thumb – a rubber pad under the paper will be helpful. Lift the hand away carefully, making sure that you do not blur the print (d).
